




- 1. You are hereby appointed an investigating officer, pursuant to AR 15-6, to investigate the alleged Escalation of Force resulting in the death of a local national involving Headquarters Headquarters Company, 2-101 Brigade Troops Battalion on or about 22 April 2006. You are to make specific findings and recommendations concerning the causes of the incident. Until the investigation is completed, this will be your primary duty responsibility.
- 2. Your investigations and findings will include, but not be limited to the following:
  - a. The exact time and place of the incident.
- b. How exactly the incident occurred, to include the events leading up to and concurrent with the incident.
  - c. The type of weapon(s) involved in the incident.
  - d. The soldier's mission at the time of the incident.
- e. The existence, training and type of risk assessment and safety measures taken prior to the incident.
- f. Additionally, if negligence is found, analyze what steps could be taken in the future to avoid it.
  - g. Any other matters you deem relevant.
- 3. You will use informal procedures under AR 15-6, Chapter 4. If, during your investigation, you suspect that persons you intend to interview may have violated any provision of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) or any other criminal law, you must advise them of their rights under the UCMJ, Article 31 as documented on DA Form 3881. Witness statements should be sworn and recorded on DA Form 2823.
- 4. Prepare the report of proceedings on DA Form 1574 and submit the original to me by the above suspense. You will also complete a storyboard documenting the incident to be attached to the report of proceedings. You must submit any requests for delay to me in

writing. Include with your report all documentary evidence, sworn statements, and other information or evidence you considered.

- 5. Before proceeding with the investigation you must contact the Brigade Annex for an initial legal briefing. She will serve as your primary legal advisor and can be reached at
- 6. By virtue of your appointment, you may direct the assistance of personnel with special technical knowledge to assist or advise you during your investigation. Requests should be coordinated through your legal advisor.
- 7. If during the course of your investigation you discover systemic training deficiencies that potentially caused or contributed to the incident under investigation, you will immediately contact your legal advisor for further guidance.

### MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Findings and Recommendations for Investigation #06-149 (Escalation of Force)

1. On 22 April 2006 at 0935 hours, the property of A Co. 2-101 BTB, fired at a local national driving a four door sedan on the property resulting in his death after the local national failed to comply with warnings to not approach. Overall, proper escalation of force was observed and no actions should be taken against the members of Strike Iron Claw.

### 6

2. Summary of the Facts.

On 22 APP 2006, Strike Iron Claw (SIC) was tasked with a RTE clearance mission of maintain freedom of movement in AO Talon for Coalition Forces (CF). In preparation for the mission, the platoon leader ( gave a mission brief to bring forward the specific tasks before the platoon. Among the issues discussed in the mission brief was the distinct threat of VBIED's due to a strike two days prior. Before leaving to conduct the mission. eviewed the Rules of Engagement (ROE) for threatening vehicles as is the standard in A Co. During this review, all members of the platoon clearly understood the actions they were to take in the event of a possible VBIED attack. (Note: For clarification the actions they were to take followed the shout, show, provide warning shots, attempt to disable the vehicle, and finally shoot the driver 1 Once this was complete the platoon loaded into their vehicles and began movement. of A Co. 2-101 BTB was assigned as the turret gunner for the lead vehicle of the clearance mission for that day (RG-31, A22).

At approximately 0930, Strike Iron Claw turned onto moving west. Within five minutes, SIC was located at grid coordinates when a local national. white, four door sedan began to approach SIC. When the vehicle came within 120m of SIC, a Stop sign paddle was waived to inform the local nationals within the vehicle to discontinue their approach. The vehicle did not cease and a smoke grenade was launched toward the vehicle as a warning at 100m from SIC. At this point the vehicle slowed briefly, but then began to come at SIC at a faster rate of speed. It became necessary at this point for SIC to fire two 5.56 ball rounds at the vehicle in an attempt to disable the vehicle. One round was fired at the engine compartment on the drivers' side and was later found to have hit the front, drivers side tire. The second round impacted the engine block and ricocheted out of the engine compartment. When the vehicle was at 40m from SIC, it still showed no signs of following the Rules of Engagement (ROE) for the Iraq stopping. In response, theater of operations, fired a single 5.56 round from his M4at the driver in an attempt to disable him.

After the shot was fired, the vehicle veered off the road and stopped. Members of SIC moved towards the vehicle to assess the situation and found the driver alive, but seriously injured. Medics were called in to provide assistance in an effort to keep the local national alive. When the medic arrived from his position in the Buffalo he found the LN with a gunshot wound to the lower part of the chin. He immediately began to position the body in an effort to treat the wound and stop the bleeding. Simultaneously, escalation of force was called in to B Co 1-502IN. Within five minutes of treating the wounded local national an emergency medical evacuation (MEDEVAC) was called into the 1-502 TOC. SIC began moving the local national towards in order to meet the medevac. At 0955, the local national was declared dead on arrival at the local helipad.

Soon after the platoon recomposed themselves and, understanding that an investigation would ensue, began movement back to the site of the escalation of force. When they returned to the site, they found that the vehicle was missing. They interviewed the local nationals present and discovered that the uncle, who was the passenger in the vehicle during the shooting, had already called for a wrecker and had the vehicle towed. They asked where the vehicle was located and the uncle replied it was taken to the drivers' residence. After some convincing, the uncle agreed to take the platoon to the residence. Maintaining situational stopped the platoon approximately 400 meters from the final destination due to the dubious layout of the road leading to the house. The platoon was able to convince four local nationals who had been traveling on the road (and happened to be related to the uncle) to retrieve the car and push it to them. They obliged and brought it to them allowing the platoon to take pictures of the vehicle. The platoon concluded the incident by returning to and taking pictures of the deceased body. Afterwards, they finished their mission and returned to Camp Striker.

### 3. Findings.

After carefully considering the evidence, I find that:

- a. The members of Strike Iron Claw were sufficiently trained on the Rules of Engagement (ROE) for the Iraq theater of operations.
- b. The felt the vehicle was an immediate threat to the safety and welfare of himself and his platoon, resulting in the escalation of force.
- c. gave the local national driving the vehicle more than ample time and warning to stop the vehicle.
- d. The leadership took the proper precautions by briefing the platoon on the possible threat of VBIED's.
- e. The members of Strike Iron Claw acted quickly and properly in an effort to save the local nationals life.



### CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS Investigation #06-149 (Escalation of Force)

22 APR 2006  0930 – Strike Iron Claw conducted movement onto 1993  0935 – An unidentified white vehicle begins to conduct movement towards SIC.  0938 – Escalation of Force called in. SIC begins to assess the situation and provide medical assistance.
0944 – SIC requests MEDEVAC through 1-502 and conducts movement to 0955 – SIC arrives at 1955. LN declared dead on arrival.  Approx. 1045 – SIC moves out to take pictures of the EOF area and the vehicle.  Approx. 1130 – SIC returns to 1956.  Approx. 1215 – SIC finds the vehicle and takes pictures.
24 APR 2006 Initiated investigation. Reviewed incident and materials to conduct the investigation. Talked to A Co. 1SG and XO and collected the SIR, pictures of the incident, and initial company products of the incident.
Gained sworn statements from those involved. Interviewed (Medic), and (PL). All interviewed were concise and to the point. There were no signs of deception and all questions were answered clearly. Reviewed the company's standard for ROE training. Reviewed all of the sworn statements and compared them to the stories given. The interviews and sworn statements matched up.






