2. SUMMARY:



Once he ascertained that no one was injured and that no follow-on attack was imminent, CPT condered a squad from the second truck under the leadership of Sergeant First Class to dismount, clear the field and house to the north, and circle back west to set up a cordon behind the IED to stop traffic from the west. SFC condend his squad moved to the house, cleared it, and moved on to set up their cordon. CPT condended his second patrol from the first truck under the leadership of Sergeant First Class to clear the area south of RTE Cannucks. The trucks remained in place to block traffic coming from the east. The Scout sniper team remained on the trucks to provide additional security and cover for the dismounts.

After the patrols departed, CPT and others still in the vehicles observed Iraqi nationals leaving the house to the north and moving into the field. The group consisted of one or two males and an undetermined number of females, not more than ten. The soldiers also heard yelling and what sounded like crying. They watched the group move to the field and pick up something that was wrapped/dressed in white and looked like a body. The Iraqis left the scene and moved back towards the house carrying the object.

to the house and search it again. The squad did so and reported that they saw no evidence of a body at the house. Also, they did not observe any blood trail on the road leading to the house.

During the next Estonian mission in the area on 19 November 2005, CPT stopped at the house again to talk to the occupants. They showed him documents written in Arabic. The interpreter read the papers and told CPT that the document was a death certificate relating to the death of a 13 year old Iraqi girl on 12 November 2005. The cause of death was shooting.

- b) The Estonians sent out dismounted patrols to clear the area, search for trigger men, and set up their cordon in accordance with SOP.
 - a. One dismounted patrol searched a nearby house and reported nothing out of the ordinary.
 - None of the dismounted patrols identified any blood trail or evidence of a casualty.
- c) A group of Iraqis left the house and moved into the field, picked up something wrapped in white that looked like a body, and carried it away towards the house. CPT the thought it might be a body and subsequently dispatched a second patrol to the house. This patrol found no evidence of a body or blood either on the road to the house or in the house.


- d) Of his own accord, CPT returned to the house a week later to ask about the incident and conduct his own independent investigation.
 - a. The occupants of the house produced a death certificate in Arabic. (Exhibit 11)
 - b. CPT meaning interpreter read the document.
 - The document identified the deceased as a 13 year old girl.
 - The time of death was 12 November 2005.

- e) The terrain at the site of the shooting prohibited the Estonians from seeing a person in the field prior to the shooting. The area where the "body" was found is depressed and bordered with weeds. Between the road and the field there exist a canal, a berm, a ditch, and a smaller berm. All of these terrain features obstruct the view of the field from the road, creating dead space. Additionally, trees and other vegetation (weeds, etc.), present at the time of the incident and visible from the imagery but since removed, blocked the view of the field from the trucks at the time of the incident (Exhibits 15-20).

4. FINDINGS:



b) CPT suspected that his platoon had killed someone. He returned to the house seven days later on his own in order to ensure that the incident was reported correctly. On the day of the IED, he should have reported the possible killing to Thunder X-Ray and reacted more quickly to determine whether or not a body was actually present. If he had acted more quickly, his soldiers would have found the body before it was taken away and removed all doubt as to whether or not someone was killed by Coalition Forces.

c) There was a critical communication breakdown due to the existing language barrier between U.S. and Estonian forces. SSG from the Scout Platoon, who was in the second Unimog, reported that before the group of Iraqis left the house, he observed the object lying in the field and identified it as a female body. He mentioned it to the Estonian gunner still in the Unimog and asked if he should go investigate it. The gunner responded that CPT had instructed that the Americans remain in the trucks to provide cover and security for his dismounted patrols. I do not think the gunner actually understood what SSG in the meant, only


that he wanted to dismount the truck. SSC allso reported that after the Iraqis arrived at their house, he observed a pickup truck leave the area. If the body was put in the pickup and taken to the hospital, it would explain why there was no evidence of a body at the house when the second Estonian dismounted patrol arrived there.

d) The Estonians ride low in their trucks to decrease their chances of being hurt in the event of an IED blast. Riding low prevented them from being able to look down and see the person in the field. SSG is over six feet tall and he did not see the body in the field until he stood up in the bed of the truck. It is probable that while suppressing the area, someone aimed at the berm or into the trees and unknowingly penetrated them, thereby killing the unseen girl who was hiding on the other side.



here is no evidence to suggest that the killing was intentional. Members of the patrol did identify civilians in the area during the shooting and purposely avoided engaging them with direct fire in accordance with orders (Exhibit 9). The terrain was rural so there was no reason to believe that rounds not aimed at a person would strike someone. The girl probably hid in fear after the initial IED blast. Had she made her presence known to the patrol, she would probably have survived.

- 1. Pursuant to AR 15-6, paragraph 2-1, you are hereby appointed as an investigating officer to investigate the engagement of suspected IED triggerman sites by Estonian and American forces from TF 2-70 Armor on 12 November 2005 that may have resulted in the death of a local national civilian.
- 2. In your investigation, use procedures under AR 15-6, Chapter 4, for an informal board of officers. All witness statements will be sworn, and you will follow the procedures in AR 15-6, paragraph 3-7e for Privacy Act statements. If the person you are interviewing states that he/she does not know anything about the allegations, prepare a sworn statement to that affect for the witness to sign. If, in the course of your investigation, you suspect a soldier has committed an offense under the UCMJ, you must advise and read him/her their rights under the UCMJ, Article 31, or the Fifth Amendment, as appropriate, prior to conducting any interview.
- 3. In your investigation, you need to answer the following questions:
 - a. What was the sequence of events that led up to the incident?
 - b. Did the soldiers involved properly escalate the use of force?
 - c. Did the patrol have Positive Identification (were they reasonable certain that the local national was a legitimate military target) before engaging?
 - d. Was deadly force authorized?
 - e. Were there any Law of War violations?
 - f. Are there any operational lessons that should be captured and disseminated?
 - g. Were there any other contributing factors that, if changed, could have altered the outcome?
- 4. If it becomes evident that there is possible misconduct outside the scope of your investigation, notify the appointing authority immediately. If during your investigation

On 12 November 2005 Estonian Platoon 11 conducted an extraction of a Scout Sniper/Ambush Team near RTE Northstars. After extracting the team the Estonian Platoon, consisting of 1 x M1114 and 2 x Estonian Unimog trucks, continued on its patrol. On 120850NOV05 the M1114 (third in the order of march) was attacked by an IED while traveling east on RTE Cannucks at grid MB The IED caused no injuries to Coalition Forces and caused minor damage to the M1114.

Once he ascertained that no one was injured and that no follow-on attack was imminent, CPT dered a squad from the second truck under the leadership of Sergeant First Class dismount, clear the field and house to the north, and circle back west to set up a cordon behind the IED engagement area. He sent a second patrol from the first truck under the leadership of Sergeant First Class clear the area south of RTE Cannucks.

After the patrols departed, CPT and and others still in the vehicles observed Iraqi nationals leaving the house to the north and moving into the field. The group consisted of one or two males and an undetermined number of females, not more than ten. The soldiers also heard yelling and what sounded like crying. They watched the group move to the field and pick up something that was wrapped/dressed in white and looked like a body. The Iraqis left the scene and moved back towards the house carrying the object. SSG and from the Scout Platoon who was in the first truck reported that shortly after the group reached the house he saw a pickup truck leave the house. CPT and and others still in the vehicles observed Iraqi

squad to move to the house and search it again. The squad did so and reported that they saw no evidence of a body at the house. Also, they did not observe any blood trail on the road leading to the house.

During the next Estonian mission in the area on 19 November 2005, CPT ppped at the house again to talk to the occupants. They showed him documents written in Arabic. The interpreter read the papers and told CPT that the document was a death certificate relating to the death of an Iraqi girl on 12 November 2005. The cause of death was shooting.

Following a Commander's Inquiry an AR15-6 investigation has been initiated into the incident to determine whether a local national was killed and if so the cause of death.

- 1. You are hereby appointed an Investigating Officer pursuant to conduct a Commanders Inquiry, to investigate the circumstances surrounding the possible shooting of a local national by Stone 11 on 13NOV05.
- 2. In your investigation, all witness statements will be swom and Privacy Act Statements taken. From the evidence, you will make specific findings into the circumstances behind the incident and the potential for criminal or administrative liability. You will also make recommendations for corrective action to prevent similar acts or incidents and for administrative and/or disciplinary action, if appropriate.
- 3. You may obtain advice and assistance from the Administrative Law Division, Office of the Staff Judge Advocate. Administrative support will be provided by CPT the Brigade Legal Office located at Taji, 242-6306.
- 4. Prior to interviewing any service member whom you suspect may have violated the UCMJ, you must provide an Article 31 rights warning. The Article 31 rights warning should be done using DA Form 3881. Please consult with your legal advisor for more information.
- 5. Coordinate and report to the Task Force Executive Officer upon receipt of this order for an initial briefing.
- 6. Submit your findings and recommendations, with continuation sheets, enclosures, and exhibits to the S1 Office upon completion. Point of contact for this memorandum is CPT 422-6536.

Once he ascertained that no one was injured and that no follow-on attack was imminent, CPT control ordered a squad from the second truck under the leadership of Sergeant First Class and dismount, clear the field and house to the north, and circle back west to set up a cordon behind the IED to stop traffic from the west. SFC control his squad moved to the house, cleared it, and moved on to set up their cordon. CPT sent a second patrol from the first truck under the leadership of Sergeant First Class to clear the area south of RTE Cannucks. The trucks remained in place to block traffic coming from the east. The Scout sniper team remained on the trucks to provide additional security and cover for the dismounts.

After the patrols departed, CPT and others still in the vehicles observed Iraqi nationals leaving the house to the north and moving into the field. The group consisted of one or two males and an undetermined number of females, not more than ten. The soldiers also heard yelling and what sounded like crying. They watched the group move to the field and pick up something that was wrapped/dressed in white and looked like a body. The Iraqis left the scene and moved back towards the house carrying the object.

CPT services of a search it again. The squad did so and reported that they saw no evidence of a body at the house. Also, they did not observe any blood trail on the road leading to the house.

During the next Estonian mission in the area on 19 November 2005, CPT stopped at the house again to talk to the occupants. They showed him documents written in Arabic. The interpreter read the papers and told CPT that the document was a death certificate relating to the death of a 13 year old Iraqi girl on 12 November 2005. The cause of death was shooting.

3. FACTS:

- b) The Estonians sent out dismounted patrols to clear the area, search for trigger men, and set up their cordon in accordance with SOP.
 - a. One dismounted patrol searched a nearby house and reported nothing out of the ordinary.
 - b. None of the dismounted patrols identified any blood trail or evidence of a casualty.
- c) A group of Iraqis left the house and moved into the field, picked up something wrapped in white that looked like a body, and carried it away towards the house. CPY the thought it might be a body and subsequently dispatched a second patrol to the house. This patrol found no evidence of a body or blood either on the road to the house or in the house.


- d) Of his own accord, CPT seturned to the house a week later to ask about the incident and conduct his own independent investigation.
 - a. The occupants of the house produced a death certificate in Arabic. (Exhibit 11)
 - b. CPT interpreter read the document.
 - The document identified the deceased as a 13 year old girl.
 - The time of death was 12 November 2005.

- · The cause of death was shooting.
- e) The terrain at the site of the shooting prohibited the Estonians from seeing a person in the field prior to the shooting. The area where the "body" was found is depressed and bordered with weeds. Between the road and the field there exist a canal, a berm, a ditch, and a smaller berm. All of these terrain features obstruct the view of the field from the road, creating dead space. Additionally, trees and other vegetation, present at the time of the incident and visible from the imagery but since removed, blocked the view of the field from the trucks at the time of shooting (Exhibits 15-20).

4. FINDINGS:



b) CPT suspected that his platoon had killed someone. He returned to the house seven days later on his own to find out for sure. On the day of the IED, he should have reported the possible killing to Thunder X-Ray and reacted more quickly to determine whether or not a body was actually present. If he had acted more quickly, his soldiers would have found the body before it was taken away and removed all doubt as to whether or not someone was killed by Coalition Forces.

c) There was a critical communication breakdown due to the existing language barrier between U.S. and Estonian forces. SSG from the Scout Platoon, who was in the second Unimog, reported that before the group of Iraqis left the house, he observed the object lying in the field and identified it as a female body. He mentioned it to the Estonian gunner still in the Unimog and asked if he should go investigate it. The gunner responded that CPT had instructed that the Americans remain in the trucks to provide cover and security for his dismounted patrols. I do not think the gunner actually understood what SSG the language reported that after the Iraqis arrived at their house, he observed a pickup



truck leave the area. If the body was put in the pickup and taken to the hospital, it would explain why there was no evidence of a body at the house when the second Estonian dismounted patrol arrived there.


d) The Estonians ride low in their trucks to decrease their chances of being hurt in the event of an IED blast. Riding low prevented them from being able to look down and see the person in the field. SSG didn't see the body in the field until he stood up in the bed of the truck. It is probable that while suppressing the area, someone aimed at the berm and unknowingly penetrated it, thereby killing the unseen girl who was hiding on the other side.
