1. Claimants name and address: (b)(6) Kirkuk, Iraq.
2. Incident date and place the incident occurred giving rise to the claim: Incident occurred on 31 October 2005 in Kirkuk, Iraq.
3. Amount of claim and filing date: Claimant filed a claim in the amount of \$2,620.00 on 6 March 2006.
4. Chapter the claim was considered under and a brief description of the incident or of the issues raised by the claimant on reconsideration: Foreign Claims Act and Chapter 10, AR 27-20; claim filed for damages to vehicle and wrongful death.
5. Facts:
 - a. (b)(6) claims that on 31 October 2005, Coalition Forces (CF) shot and killed his son (b)(6).
 - b. There was a police report, witness statements, photographs, medical reports, death certificate and estimates included in the submitted claim. CF provided a 15-6 and purchase order-invoice-voucher.
 - c. A condolence payment has already been given to the wife ((b)(6)).
6. Opinion:
 - a. In order to form a basis for a claim under the FCA, the incident in question must have arisen outside the United States. In addition, the incident must be caused by either non-combat activities of the United States Armed Forces or by negligent or wrongful acts of military members or civilian employees of the Armed Forces.

MEMORANDUM FOR Commanding Officer 1st Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), FOB Warrior, Kirkuk Iraq.

SUBJECT: Request for monies from the 2-327 IN CERP Commander's Battle Damage Fund.

- The purpose of this memorandum is to request a Battle Damage Payment be made to (b)(6) wife of the deceased, in order to express sympathy for Coalition Forces caused damage to the property of an Iraqi Citizen that occurred on 31 October 2005 in Kirkuk..
- Description of the incident predicating this payment request: On 31 OCT 05 at 1740hrs C/2-327 reported that while driving on (b)(2)High C16 convoy observed a vehicle in the opposite lane pull out from a line of stopped vehicles and accelerated towards the convoy. The gunner (SPC(b)(3)(b)(6)) waved a chemical light at the vehicle and then threw the chemical light towards the vehicle in an effort to alert the driver. When the driver still did not stop, the gunner fired one .50 cal round at the vehicle, which entered the windshield and grazed the driver (Yussef Ibrahim (T)) in the right shoulder and caused damage to the windshield, front and rear upholstery. Contact has been made with the driver's nephew (b)(6) to facilitate payment of \$300 as compensation to the wife of the owner of the vehicle. 2-327 IN utilized an interpreter to call a auto body shop to estimate repair costs for the windshield, front and rear upholstery and trunk of a 4 door, late 1990s model Opel.

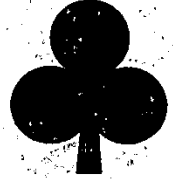

SUBJECT: Legal Sufficiency of AR 15-6 Investigation, Shooting of (b)(6)

1. I find the investigation conducted by CPT (b)(3)(b)(6) legally sufficient.
2. CPT (b)(3)(b)(6) interviewed the pertinent parties, gathered the relevant facts, and made a supportable recommendation based upon those findings.
3. The proceedings complied with legal requirements. The findings were properly recorded on the DA Form 1574 and statements were taken on DA Forms 2823. In appropriate instances, DA Forms 3881 were used to notify the individuals interviewed of their rights.
4. The circumstances surrounding the escalation of force is addressed and the IO properly applied the law—namely the Rules of Engagement—to the facts.

Findings

On 31 October 05, I was appointed as the AR 15-6 Investigating Officer responsible for investigating the circumstances surrounding the shooting of an Iraqi civilian on 31 October 05 in the city of Kirkuk by members of C Company, 2nd Battalion, 327th Infantry Regiment. I present these findings having interviewed the gunner who was directly responsible for the shooting, four soldiers from his platoon, and personally evaluating the incident site.

Prior to movement from FOB Warrior, SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) briefed the MNCI Rules of Engagement (ROE) to the convoy and 1LT (b)(3)(b)(6) briefed the standards for Escalation of Force required for the upcoming patrol. SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) briefed the ROE in accordance with CFLCC/ MNCI smart cards. Prior to moving out, the patrol received an intelligence report stating to be on the lookout for a possible Suicide Vehicle Borne Improvised Explosive Device (SVBIED) in the form of a dark blue Opel. The convoy planned to travel to K1, meet with their IA counterpart company, and the return to FOB Warrior.

Upon completion of the mission at K1, the Charlie Company convoy began its movement back to FOB warrior at approximately 1645 traveling south along (b)(2)High (b)(2)High. The illumination was natural, given that there were no streetlights in the area. The vehicle in question, Bumper Number C14, was occupied with a crew from vehicle C16. Their vehicle was hit the previous day by an IED. It was the lead vehicle in the convoy. The crew of C16 consisted of the driver, SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) the TC, 1LT (b)(3)(b)(6), the gunner, SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) the Platoon RTO, PFC (b)(3)(b)(6) and their interpreter, (b)(3)(b)(6).

During movement the convoy experienced some traffic vicinity of (b)(2)High. At this time responded in accordance with one of their established TTPs by slowing down, flashing their lights and honking their horn. Both the driver and gunner motioned for the vehicles to pull off to the sides of the road. The local vehicles adhered, and began to pull off onto the shoulders of the two lane road. The shoulders of the road are at least one vehicle wide, allowing for more than enough room for traffic to shift over.

Most of the vehicles in the oncoming lane pulled off on to the shoulder of the road. If they did not pull completely onto the shoulder, they at least stopped moving and turned on their blinkers. As vehicles were pulling off the road SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) 1LT (b)(3)(b)(6) and SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) all observed a car attempting to bypass the others. While the bypassing car was four to five vehicles ahead of C16, they noticed that it was a dark colored Opel similar to the description given during the morning's intelligence report. At the same time, another white vehicle swerved back onto the road and attempted to continue driving. SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) and SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) again signaled for these vehicles to pull off the road. SPC (b)(3)(b)(6), while standing up in the turret, signaled for both vehicles to pull over using a chem light that he was waving and by shouting at the vehicle. The white vehicle adhered and pulled back of the road in front of the dark Opel, but the dark Opel never pulled off. Rather he continued towards C16 in what appeared to be a collision course. None of the C16 crew members were able to see any of the occupants of the oncoming

vehicle. As the Opel continued on towards him, SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) continued to yell and then threw his chem light in the direction of the vehicle's path. The Opel continued towards C16 and it was at this time that SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) charged his weapon and oriented at the vehicles hood. The Opel still did not change its course and appeared to be accelerating. The vehicle continued closer and closer until finally SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) decided that the vehicle appeared to be getting too close and did not think it was going to stop. Though he had an (b)(2)High as an alternate weapon, did not use it. Instead, at approximately (b)(2)High away SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) fired a single round from his (b)(2)High at the dark Opel. It impacted high on the driver's side windshield and hit the driver in his right shoulder. Although 1LT (b)(3)(b)(6) had been communicating with the driver to continue to flash his lights and honk his horn and pull off to the side of the road, he never gave any command to the gunner regarding engaging the vehicle.

The drivers name was (b)(6) the other occupants of the car were his wife and two children. After engaging, C16 continued down the road for approximately two hundred meters when 1LT (b)(3)(b)(6) called over his Icom radio to tell the convoy that they were turning around. When the HMMWV reached the now disabled vehicle, (b)(6) had already been taken out of the vehicle and moved approximately 20 meters away. Mr. (b)(6) was then taken to about 15m off the road to the 1/C/2-327 IN medic, PFC (b)(3)(b)(6) who administered First Aid. The bleeding was stopped, and at this time Mr. (b)(6) still had a pulse. He was then placed into a white civilian vehicle and was taken to Kirkuk General Hospital. At approximately 1925, the 2-327th IN CP received notice from CPT (b)(3)(b)(6) that Mr. (b)(6) had died as a result of his wounds.
