1. (C) Appointment. You are hereby appointed an investigating officer pursuant to Army Regulation (AR) 15-6, Procedure for Investigating Officers and Boards of Officers, to conduct an informal investigation into the actions on OBJ (4a, (b)) on 6 June 2006 resulting in civilian casualties, specifically, whether the use of force was appropriate. This investigation is your primary duty and takes precedence over all other duties assigned.

2. (U) <u>Legal Orientation</u>. Before you begin your investigation, you will receive a briefing from the Command Legal Advisor. Your legal advisor during the investigation will be Maj $^{(3), (b)(6)}$ (b)(3), (b)(6) You will consult with the Legal Advisor representative regarding all aspects of this investigation, including preparing findings and recommendations.

3. (U) <u>Procedures</u>. You are to conduct this investigation using the informal procedures outlined in Chapter 4, AR 15-6. No individual has been named as a respondent at this time. You are to thoroughly document all witness interviews in writing. Consult your legal advisor prior to advising anyone of his or her rights.

4. (U) <u>Report of Investigation</u>. The report of investigation should include findings on the following specific issues:

a. (U) Determine the scheme of maneuver and key events that occurred on the objective.

b. (U) Identify what element directed/authorized the (b)(2)High and whether the decision was in accordance with the Rules of Engagement (ROE) and reasonable under the circumstances as known at that time.

c. (U) Were the weapon effects confined to the target that was identified in the call for fire)(2)Hig request?

d. (U) What caused the secondary explosions that resulted in the house catching fire?

e. (U) Were there collateral deaths? How many? What was the proximate cause of these deaths?
