6. INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY: THE INFORMATION IN THIS REPORT IS BASED UPON
AN ALLEGATION OR PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION AND MAY CHANGE PRIOR TO
THE COMPLETION OF THE INVESTIGATION.

THIS IS AN "OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM" INVESTIGATION.

On 2 Jun 04, this investigation was initiated based on a Memorandum of Transmittal 0171-04-
CID919 from the 75th Military Police Detachment (CID) (FWD), LSA Anaconda, Balad, IZ,
which related [REDACTED] was mistreated and threatened while detained at an unknown facility
in Balad, IZ and had 30,300,000.00 Iraqi Dinar seized from him, of which only 8 million was
returned to him upon his release.

Investigation established there was insufficient evidence to substantiate [REDACTED] claim of
cruelty and maltreatment and aggravated assault. Therefore, the allegations were unfounded.
[REDACTED] was stopped at a security checkpoint for transporting an excess of 25 million Iraqi
Dinar. He was then transported to a temporary detention facility in Balad, IZ. [REDACTED]
money was transported by [REDACTED], who subsequently turned the money over to the 118th
Infantry Battalion's S2 office for safekeeping. After recounting the money, it was determined
there was only 8 million Iraqi Dinar, which indicated there was no reason to hold [REDACTED]
however, [REDACTED] refused to leave without all of his money, maintaining he had
30,300,000.00 Iraqi Dinar, and he stayed of his own free will. [REDACTED] related the money
had been acquired through the sale of the village livestock and he could not return to his village
without the money. [REDACTED] filed a claim and was forced to leave a few days later with only
8 million Iraqi Dinar.

Investigation established there was sufficient evidence to believe [REDACTED] [REDACTED]
[REDACTED], and [REDACTED] were derelict in their duties for not maintaining the
proper accountability of the 30.3 million Iraqi Dinar. It was determined through the conduct of
this investigation [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] all had
contact with the money but never properly documented the transfer of the money, nor did they
maintain any type of chain of custody.

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Investigation further established there was sufficient evidence to substantiate the offense of larceny occurred but a thorough investigation did not identify a subject.

Further investigation did not develop any definitive information leading to the identity of the unknown person(s) who stole [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] funds. During the interview of [REDACTED] he related he and [REDACTED] counted the money, and he thought a translator, whom he could not identify, read the receipts in question. [REDACTED] related there was no accountability procedure for tracking funds, other than the two people who counted the money and the statements they provided. [REDACTED] related he remembered the amount as being 29 million Dinar, and he related [REDACTED] was the individual that transported [REDACTED] and the money, which was in a box. [REDACTED] denied taking the money.

However, [REDACTED] related he [REDACTED] never touched the money and he did not transport [REDACTED] or the money. [REDACTED] also related [REDACTED] did not count the money, as they had Mr. DALEF HALUB, ICDC (now deceased) view the money and give them an estimate of how much money was in the box. [REDACTED] indicated [REDACTED] and the money were transported to the battalion by the LOGPACK and not by him, as stated by [REDACTED]. Further coordination with [REDACTED], subsequent to his interview, revealed that due to the extreme amount of time that has past he could not remember who drove the vehicles in the LOGPAC, all documentation was required either to be turned over to the incoming unit or to be destroyed prior to redeployment, and all computer hard drives (used in Iraq) were wiped, as per Army Operational Security Regulations. Efforts to locate documentation listing the members of the LOGPAC met with negative results.

Further investigation did not develop sufficient information to prove or disprove [REDACTED] allegation that he was assaulted by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] allegation that he was beaten and threatened by [REDACTED]. During the interview of [REDACTED] 319th Military Intelligence BN, Camp Slayer/Victory, Iraq he related while working with [REDACTED] he never saw [REDACTED] abuse any detainees, or heard him threaten to put [REDACTED] in jail, or beat him. Further, during the interview of [REDACTED] he related he never saw [REDACTED] abuse [REDACTED]. On 20 Jun 05, attempts were made to interview [REDACTED]. However, [REDACTED] invoked his rights and requested a lawyer. Additionally, [REDACTED] refused to cooperate any further with this investigation.

30,300,000.00 LRAQI DINAR SEIZED FROM HIM, OF WHICH ONLY 8 MILLION
WAS RETURNED TO HIM UPON HIS RELEASE.

INVESTIGATION ESTABLISHED THERE WAS INSUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO
SUBSTANTIATE [REDACTED] CLAIM OF CRUELTY AND MALTREATMENT
AND AGGRAVATED ASSAULT. THEREFORE, THE ALLEGATIONS WERE
UNFOUNDED. [REDACTED] WAS STOPPED AT A SECURITY CHECKPOINT

AFTER RECOUNTING THE MONEY, IT WAS DETERMINED THERE WAS ONLY 8 MILLION IRAQI DINAR, WHICH INDICATED THERE WAS NO REASON TO HOLD [REDACTED] HOWEVER, [REDACTED] REFUSED TO LEAVE WITHOUT ALL OF HIS MONEY, MAINTAINING HE HAD 30,300,000.00 IRAQI DINAR, AND HE STAYED OF HIS OWN FREE WILL. [REDACTED] RELATED THE MONEY HAD BEEN ACQUIRED THROUGH THE SALE OF THE VILLAGE LIVESTOCK AND HE COULD NOT RETURN TO HIS VILLAGE WITHOUT THE MONEY. [REDACTED] FILED A CLAIM AND WAS FORCED TO LEAVE A FEW DAYS LATER WITH ONLY 8 MILLION LRAQI DINAR.

INVESTIGATION ESTABLISHED THERE WAS SUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO BELIEVE [REDACTED], [REDACTED], AND [REDACTED] WERE DERELICT IN THEIR DUTIES FOR NOT MAINTAINING THE PROPER ACCOUNTABILITY OF THE 30.3 MILLION IRAQI DINAR. IT WAS DETERMINED THROUGH THE CONDUCT OF THIS INVESTIGATION [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED] ALL HAD CONTACT WITH THE MONEY BUT NEVER PROPERLY DOCUMENTED THE TRANSFER OF THE MONEY, NOR DID THEY MAINTAIN ANY TYPE OF CHAIN OF CUSTODY.

Investigation established there was insufficient evidence to substantiate [REDACTED] claim of Cruelty and Maltreatment and Aggravated Assault. Therefore, the allegations were unfounded. [REDACTED] was stopped at a security checkpoint for transporting an excess of 25 million Iraqi Dinar. He was then transported to a temporary detention facility in Balad, IZ. [REDACTED] money was transported by [REDACTED], who subsequently turned the money over to the 1/8th Infantry Battalion's S2 Office for safekeeping. After recounting the money, it was determined there was only 8 million Iraqi Dinar, which indicated there was no reason to hold [REDACTED]. However, [REDACTED] refused to leave without all of his money, maintaining he had 30,300,000.00 Iraqi Dinar, and he stayed of his own free will. [REDACTED] related the money had been acquired through the sale of the village livestock and he could not return to his village without the money. [REDACTED] filed a claim and was forced to leave a few days later with only 8 million Iraqi Dinar.

Investigation established there was sufficient evidence to believe [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were Derelict in their Duties for not maintaining the proper accountability of the 30.3 million Iraqi Dinar. It was determined through the conduct of this investigation [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] all had contact with the money but never properly documented the transfer of the money, nor did they maintain any type of chain of custody.

Investigation further established there was sufficient evidence to substantiate the offense of Larceny occurred but a thorough investigation did not identify a subject.

I, want to make the following statement under oath:

An Iraqi individual was detained at the nearby Iraqi Civil Defense Corps check-point with approximately \$30 million Iraqi dinar. This was over the 25 million dinar limit where individuals had to explain the source of their money. The Iraqi was brought to my Company Headquarters on Highway One (currently the local ICDC headquarters), as per SOP, at about 1900 hours. He attempted to justify the money by showing us a two-month old receipt for \$16 million dinar written in Arabic thinking we could not read it. When the individual was confronted by the age and amount of the receipt he refused to talk to us further. He was detained at my headquarters overnight with the money, and both were sent to Battalion Headquarters the following day with the 1SG's daily logistics patrol and the standard detainee paperwork. (2 sworn statements, and the coalition detainee form) This event was never brought to my attention for the remainder of my tour in Iraq. Upon return to the U.S. on 18 March 2004, (three months later), I was told that there was an investigation regarding larceny and detainee abuse. I have no knowledge of there being any issue with the above events until the week of 7 June when I was called by CID.

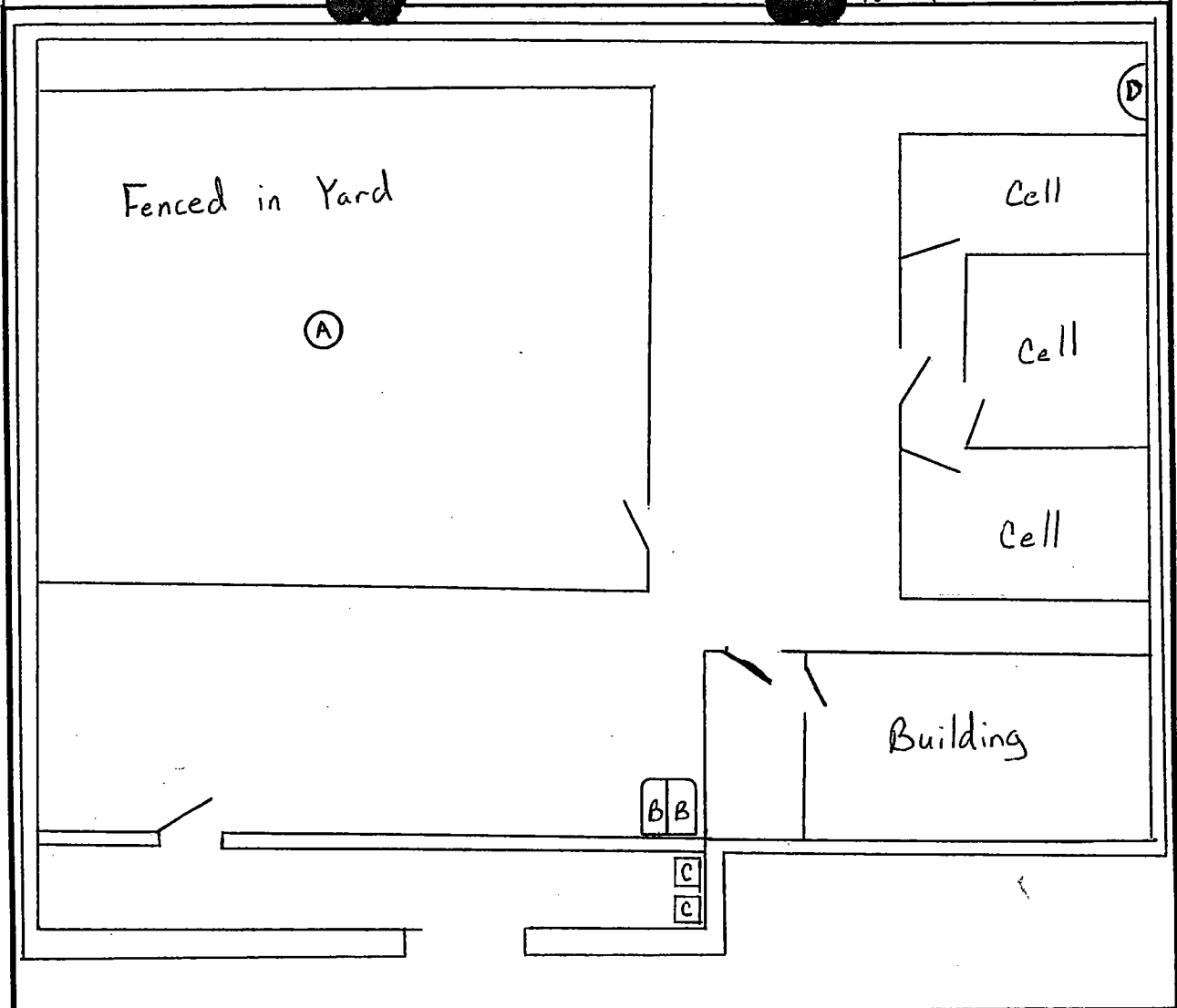



Individual was detained by the Iraqi ICDC at a highway checkpoint and transferred to the custody of my Company HQ in the early evening. I do not remember, the exact amount of his receipt, but it did not match the amount in question. I think there was a translator who read the receipt for us, but my Arabic numbers were good enough, I could have determined his story didn't wash. I questioned him about the source and use of the money, and he refused to answer my questions. 29 million dinar is an amount that sticks in my head as to the total of the money. The thing that was strange was that it was in very large bills, (10,000 and 1,000 instead of the usual bags of 250s). [REDACTED] and I were the ones that counted the money initially to determine the amount. The detainee was taken to the Bn TOC by my ISG on logpac the following day including a Bradley escort and his HUMMVEE driver around noon the next day. Included was a sworn statement by me as to why he was being detained and the amount of the money he was detained for. This sworn statement was unit SOP for accounting for detained money. There was no procedure for accounting for confiscated money other than stating the amount in the two sworn statements that were transferred with the individual. Transfers in amounts well over a 100 million dinar took place in this manner over a half dozen times during our tour without incident of complaint. That this 29 million dinar would be stolen while 100s of millions was not doesn't really make much sense to me, but it was near then of the tour, so all things are possible. I did not take any of the money in question and do not know if it was stolen or who did. [REDACTED]

 On 25 Jul 05, [REDACTED] Operations Officer, 11th MP Bn (CID), Camp Victory, Iraq reviewed the contents of the Request for Assistance #0148-04-CID259-80211 and discussed the requested actions with [REDACTED] Commander, 11th MP Bn (CID). It was concluded interviews would be undertaken which did not unnecessarily hazard CID Agents, including those of [REDACTED] (interviewed on 28 Jul 05) and HALUB (who was later determined to have been killed in action). Additionally, research was authorized into determining the relationship between FOB Paliwoda and FOB Rock or Eagle Base. However, after careful consideration of the details provided by [REDACTED] it was the Commander's decision the lead lacks sufficient actionable and contemporaneous details to reasonably believe CID could locate [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

AGENT'S COMMENTS: The security situation in Baghdad at this time (summer 2005) is not such that CID Agents could travel into the city without severe risk of life and limb. This is due in large part to the prevalence of Suicide Vehicle Based Improvised Explosive Devices (SVBIED) and Improvised Explosive Devices (IED), kidnappings, assassinations and other hazards of combat leading up to the release (on or about 15 Aug 05) of the Iraqi Republic's new Constitution. As CID lacks the resources to support a mission organically, it would be required to obtain outside support from another unit. Our risk analysis demonstrates it does not merit taking that chance, based on the slim possibility that any of the three men listed above could be found with only one address given. Therefore, CID agents will NOT attempt to travel off the secured installations in the vain hopes of finding [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. This area should have been addressed by SA [REDACTED] at the time of the case initiation and the cost versus benefit analysis (in the opinion of the Commander) does not merit pursuit at this time. That portion of the RFA is to be returned without action and this decision and the rationale will be entered into the case file.

About 0835, 28 Jul 05, SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] Titan Corporation, International Zone, Baghdad, Iraq (IZ) APO AE 09348 who waived his legal rights and provided a sworn statement wherein he denied taking any money belonging to detainees during his deployment (See Sworn Statement of [REDACTED] for further details).

AGENT'S COMMENTS: [REDACTED] related during the time his former unit was at the Forward Operating Base (FOB) in Balad, IZ the checkpoints were ran by two Iraqi tribes. The first checkpoint was located approximately 2 kilometers from the FOB entrance and the other checkpoint was located approximately 6 kilometers beyond the first checkpoint. The first checkpoint was supervised by a local national known as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] related his unit received numerous complaints from the local nationals that [REDACTED] would steal their money at the checkpoint, hold a gun to their head and threaten the local nationals if they reported these actions to the American Coalition Forces (CF). [REDACTED] was imprisoned at Abu Ghraib prison for stealing and other various crimes. Upon his release, sometime in Jul 05, he was subsequently killed. This information was obtained by [REDACTED] from the interpreter that was assigned to the unit during

He further related to try Task Force (TF) 134, who might have information as HALUB was detained at Abu Ghraib.

About 1715, 9 Aug 05, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with [REDACTED] Theater Detainee Reporting Center (TDRC) Operator, TF 134, Building 134, Camp Victory, IZ, who reviewed the TDRC database for HALUB, which met with negative results. Further, there is a detainee area of Abu Ghraib that is in Iraqi control and TDRC does not have access to the records maintained there.

About 2310, 14 Aug 05, SA [REDACTED] obtained a copy of [REDACTED], Military Intelligence (MI) Analyst, 319th Military Police (MP) Battalion (BN), 525 MI Brigade (BDE), Camp Slayer, IZ, for the 366th MP DET (CID), Tikrit, IZ sworn statement from 0058-05-CID469-35732, which is maintained at 366th MP DET (CID), FOB Danger, Tikrit, IZ APO AE 09308, unless the case file has been closed then the case file is maintained at USACRC, Fort Belvoir, VA. All questions from SA [REDACTED] Fort Hamilton Branch Office (CID) were answered in the original statement provided by [REDACTED]. This interview was in reference to a very similar allegation as described in the RFA received from SA [REDACTED] on 25 Jul 05. (See Sworn Statement of [REDACTED] for further details).

About 1755, 21 Aug 05, SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] who denied hearing [REDACTED] (NFI) threaten to put [REDACTED] in jail, beat him or lock him up. Further, [REDACTED] related [REDACTED] was not made to stand in the rain. However, there were no hard buildings and the unit did not have materials to build any shelters. The detainees were given emergency blankets to make shelter halves and blankets for bedding. Detainees were only kept at the temporary holding facility in Forward Operating Base (FOB) Paliwonda up to 72 hours then were either released or transferred. The longest period of time a detainee was kept was a period of approximately 30 days. This person was [REDACTED] who refused to leave the FOB.

- Q. Where you in any other locations besides Balad?
- A. Yes [REDACTED]
- Q. Where were you?
- A. We went to Tuz. I don't know the dates. It was Operation Blackflag, I believe. I was on the Samarra operation which was either in late Nov or early Dec for the whole month of Dec. Then in either late Dec or early Jan 04, I went back to the FOB Paliwonda in Balad for personal gear. I did not return to Samarra. I stayed at the FOB.
- Q. What is FOB?
- A. Forward Operating Base.
- Q. When money was seized at a checkpoint, how was it transported?
- A. It was transported with the unit. However they got it to the BN pen. Sometimes it was in a Bradley, a HMMWV, or how ever they could get it to the S2.
- Q. Was it boxed, bagged or left loose?
- A. However it was found at the TCP that is how it was brought to the Pen. If it was found in a box, the box was brought. If it was found in bags, the money would be brought in the bags.
- Q. What is TCP?
- A. Traffic Control Point.
- Q. What is the Pen?
- A. A concertina wire holding facility. Brigade policy was the detainees had to be brought to the Brigade camp within 48 hours.
- Q. How long were detainees held in the Pen?
- A. I want to say the longest we held someone was 30 days and that was the individual involved in the Balad incident. He wasn't a detainee, but wouldn't leave because of the incident. Under normal circumstances the detainees would be held 3 - 4 days.
- Q. Do you recall the incident around Jan 04 involving [REDACTED] and 30.3 million Iraqi dinar being seized [REDACTED]

A. With the sheep man, yes. [REDACTED]

Q. Do you know how the money was transported to the Pen during that incident?

A. It was transported in a box. I don't know what type of vehicle. I do know we got it as a box. I filled out the property voucher, but he wouldn't sign it. That is the only way we could get him into the Pen was with the property vouchers. The actual chain of custody would begin at the Pen. [REDACTED]

Q. Who all was involved with transporting/transferring the money?

A. It was either the TCP guys, the infantry guys, on their way back to their FOB's would drop off the individuals and property to the Pen, or a 1SG would pick up the LOGPAC's and would pick up detainees, if there were any, to take to the Pen. [REDACTED]

Q. What was the procedure for handling seized money?

A. If an individual was picked up as a money trafficker, they would be inprocessed, the individuals get put in the detention facility, the property would go into the S2 shop in a cubby hole, in it's original container. The money bags are about 3 feet tall, similar to a mail bag. [REDACTED]

Q. When money was brought in was it always counted?

A. No. [REDACTED]

Q. Why?

A. Because we was a five man office and we didn't have the manpower to count dinar when we were working combat operations. If it was the big bags of money, it would be "I'm signing over X amount of bags, how deep, how wide and how tall" whether they were sealed bags or not. There was no way we could count that much dinar. [REDACTED]

Q. Did you work at any of the checkpoints in Samarra?

A. No. [REDACTED]

Q. Where did [REDACTED] work?

A. He worked in the detainment facility with me. I don't think the guy ever left the FOB. He wrote the INTSUM's. That is an Intelligence Summary. He did mostly administrative work. [REDACTED]

Q. Were you present when [REDACTED] was released from the detainment facility?

A. I don't know who that guy is. [REDACTED]

Q. Do you recall money in the amount of 210,000,000.00 dinar being seized?

A. I do not remember that amount of money coming in. I don't know where we would have kept it. [REDACTED]

Q. Did you ever hear [REDACTED] tell a detainee his money was "burned up"?

A. No. [REDACTED] hardly had anything to do with the detainees. He might have walked them out to the gate. The only time he would have dealings with the detainees would be to take them to the Brigade facility or escort them to the gate when released. An officer had to sign the detainees into the Brigade facility. [REDACTED]

Q. When a detainee was released, who released their property back to them?

A. The way it normally happened, was with the money trafficker, the money would be given back to them and then released. [REDACTED]

Q. Who signed the property form when the detainee was released?

A. No one. In most situations, about 99.9% of the time, they were happy to get their property back and they would leave. We didn't save any of our property vouchers. It's possible the documentation was handed over to the unit that relieved us. [REDACTED]

Q. Do you know what unit replaced your unit?

A. No I do not. [REDACTED]

Q. Where did [REDACTED] work?

A. He was the C Company 1SG in Ishaki, Iraq, which is west of Balad. [REDACTED]

Q. Would he have been near Samarra in Nov 03?

A. Yes. Ishaki is about half way between Samarra and Balad. [REDACTED]

Q. Did you hear him or others make any statements about him taking a pistol from [REDACTED] at a checkpoint?

A. If he was taking a detainee from a checkpoint back to the detainment facility, yes he would take the pistol. I have never heard of him walking up to an Iraqi and just taking a pistol from him. [REDACTED]

A. No. That is like the complete opposite of what ██████████ is. He is very timid and quiet. He hardly had any interaction with the detainees. ██████████

Q. Would he handle claims from the detainees when they lost property?

A. He might have. Because we were such a small shop we would do other jobs. It would have been him, myself or another NCO. ██████████

Subsequently, [REDACTED] was released, but without his money.

Further investigation determined [REDACTED] was initially captured at an Iraqi Civil Defense
Corps checkpoint and subsequently transported to the C Company, 1/8th Infantry Battalion
Headquarters. On 15 Jun 04, [REDACTED] rendered a statement stating [REDACTED] was turned over to
him by ICDC soldiers along with approximately 30 million Dinar. [REDACTED] was interviewed and
stated he counted the money along with [REDACTED]
Titan Corporation, Fairfax, VA. Investigation determined the next day, [REDACTED] and the money
were transported during a logistics run to the Battalion Headquarters in Balad, Iraq. [REDACTED]

indicated [REDACTED] was the individual who escorted [REDACTED] and the money. Investigation established there were no formal procedures in place to maintain accountability of the money, and a short time after [REDACTED] was turned over to the detention facility, the money was recounted. During the recount, there was apparently only 7 to 8 million Iraqi Dinar. Based on the lower amount of money, [REDACTED] was released from detention.

On 14 Jul 04, [REDACTED] was interviewed concerning the missing money. [REDACTED] stated he assisted [REDACTED] in counting the money, and transported the money to the Battalion S-2. On 10 Jun 04, [REDACTED] S-2, 1/8th Infantry Battalion, was interviewed and stated when [REDACTED] was received in Balad, he was assigned a number, logged in, and issued an MRE and a bottle of water per their Standard Operating Procedures. [REDACTED] stated that within an hour, he personally counted the money in the money box that was received with [REDACTED] and it contained only 7 to 8 million Iraqi Dinar. [REDACTED] stated that since that amount was below the amount requiring detention, that he and the Battalion S-2 tried to give [REDACTED] his 7 to 8 million Dinar back, but he refused to accept it. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] told him several times that the Iraqi Civil Defense Corps stole his money. Efforts to date have met with negative results in determining who stole [REDACTED] money.

On 18 Jul 05, [REDACTED] was re-interviewed as a suspect at which time he maintained he and [REDACTED] counted the money upon receiving [REDACTED] from the Iraqi Civil Defense Corps. [REDACTED] stated he could no longer recall how much money [REDACTED] had, but 29 million Dinar seemed correct. [REDACTED] stated after the money was counted he believed it was kept in a box under [REDACTED] bunk until the next day when [REDACTED] escorted [REDACTED] to the battalion in Balad. I, [REDACTED] want to make the following statement under oath:
An Iraqi individual was detained at the nearby Iraqi Civil Defense Corps check-point with approximately \$30 million Iraqi dinar. This was over the 25 million dinar limit where individuals had to explain the source of their money. The Iraqi was brought to my Company Headquarters on Highway One (currently the local ICDC headquarters), as per SOP, at about 1900 hours. He attempted to justify the money by showing us a two-month old receipt for \$16 million dinar written in Arabic thinking we could not read it. When the individual was confronted by the age and amount of the receipt he refused to talk to us further. He was detained at my headquarters overnight with the money, and both were sent to Battalion Headquarters the following day with the 1SG's daily logistics patrol and the standard detainee paperwork. (2 sworn statements, and the coalition detainee form) This event was never brought to my attention for the remainder of my tour in Iraq. Upon return to the U.S. on 18 March 2004, (three months later), I was told that there was an investigation regarding larceny and detainee abuse. I have no knowledge of there being any issue with the above events until the week of 7 June when I was called by CID.

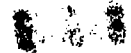

2. Preliminary investigation disclosed that on 12 Jan 04 [REDACTED] was traveling south through Balad, Iraq when he was detained by Coalition Forces. Subsequent to his detention 30, 300, 000 Iraqi Dinar were seized by Coalition Forces. [REDACTED] was released on 21 Jan 04. [REDACTED] claimed that during his time on detention coalition forces maltreated him. [REDACTED] stated that the maltreatment consisted of coalition forces guards cutting his cloths off with a bayonet and living him outside naked for approximately 12 hours. [REDACTED] stated he filed a claim through the Republic of Iraq Ministry of Human Rights, to obtain the money confiscated by coalition forces.

3. On 1 Jun 04, this incident was discussed with the 22nd MP BN, Operations Officer, who advised to prepare a MOT for the Task Force currently working all cases involving detainee maltreatment.
