Dear Ms. Goodman:

I refer to your request dated October 4, 2010 to the Department of Justice, for the release of certain material under the Freedom of Information Act (Title 5 USC Section 552). Ten of the documents retrieved in response to your request originated with the Department of State and were therefore referred to us for appropriate action.

We have determined that one document may be released with excisions and eight must be withheld in full. All released material is enclosed. One of the documents referred to us was previously denied in full to you in case no. 201100996.

An enclosure provides information on Freedom of Information Act exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made excisions, the applicable exemptions are marked on the document. Of the documents withheld in full, one was withheld under exemption (b)(1) and seven under exemption (b)(5).

In the case of the document released in part, all non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released.

This concludes the Department of State processing of this case.
