DETAILS

Basis of Investigation: On 19 Jul 04, this office received an Request for Assistance (RFA) from the 78th Military Police Detachment (CID), Baghdad, IZ, APO AE 09342, concerning an allegation of abuse by Detainee [REDACTED], National Detainee Reporting System (NDRS #) [REDACTED] while he was being detained at the Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Baghdad, IZ.

About 1740, 19 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] ^{b7C-1, b6-1} queried the Biometrics Automated Toolset (BATS) system and verified Detainee [REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} identity and confirmed that he was still detained at BCCF.

About 0900, 20 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] ^{b7C-1, b6-1} coordinated with SSG [REDACTED] ^{b7C-3, b6-3} 391th MP Bn Aid Station, BCCF, regarding Detainee [REDACTED] ^{b7C-3, b6-3} medical records. SSG [REDACTED] provided copies of Detainee [REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} medical records detailing his treatment of [REDACTED] when he allegedly passed-out in his cell on 17 May 04. SSG [REDACTED] stated that he specifically remembered the incident since he believed [REDACTED] was faking because when he called his name before entering his cell, he saw [REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} open his eyes briefly. (See attached medical records.)

About 0930, 20 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] ^{b7C-1, b6-1} with the assistance of Interpreter [REDACTED] ^{b7C-3, b6-3} Titan Corporation, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, IZ, interviewed Detainee [REDACTED] at the Detainee In-Processing Center, BCCF, AG. When questioned concerning the allegation in the RFA, [REDACTED] claimed that he had never made a complaint against anyone and denied that he had ever been maltreated by anyone since his detention. When questioned specifically about the allegation that he was handcuffed and left alone for eight-hours in a detention cell, [REDACTED] ^{b7C-1, b6-1} stated that he had never made that allegation. He did state he had spoken to a man in civilian clothing, who he believed was in the military, about being interrogated while his hands and feet were restrained by metal handcuffs and anchored to the floor of his interrogation room. During one of those interrogations, which [REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} believed occurred between two and three months ago, one of his interrogators struck him in the left shoulder. [REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} did not know which interrogator struck him. At the time he was struck, one of his interrogators was asking him about attacks on US and Coalition Forces. The blow was hard enough to knock him over and cause severe pain to his left wrist. [REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} said when he complained to his interrogators about the pain to his wrist they summoned a medical assistance. [REDACTED] stated that the medical personnel took him to a facility, which he believes was on BCCF, and took an x-ray of his wrist. The medical personnel he spoke with after the x-ray was taken told him that the nerves in his wrist were bruised, but that nothing was broken. [REDACTED] stated his wrist has healed and that he has not experienced any long-term complications from the incident.

[REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} stated that he could not remember the date he was captured or when he arrived at the BCCF. He stated that US Forces captured him in Al-Ramada. [REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} stated that he believes he has been interrogated between 40 and 50 times, and that the incident with his wrist occurred during his 20th interrogation; however, he could not be sure of the exact date or exact

^{b7c-4, b6-4} stated that while being interrogated, his hands and feet were always cuffed together and anchored to the floor, and he was always blindfolded too. ^{b7c-4, b6-4} said he believed his interrogation secession generally lasted between five and six hours. ^{b7c-4, b6-4} believed that the same two or three persons always interrogated, but never saw them. ^{b7c-4, b6-4} stated that his interrogators always asked him about killing US and Coalition Forces. ^{b7c-4, b6-4} could only describe the place he was interrogated in as a small room.

When asked if he suffered any other injuries while being detained, ^{b7c-4, b6-4} stated no. He said that he had never been injured or abused while in-custody. ^{b7c-4, b6-4} stated the last time here was interrogated, was between 15 and 20 days ago.

About 1045, 20 Jul 04, SA ^{b7c-4, b6-1} coordinated with CPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} 67th Combat Support Hospital, BCCF, AG, concerning the possible treatment of ^{b7c-4, b6-4} injured wrist. CPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} was unable to locate any treatment record or x-ray for ^{b7c-4, b6-4}. CPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} stated the x-ray might have been transferred back to the 391st MP Bn Aid Station, BCCF, AG to be included in ^{b7c-4, b6-4} medical file.

About 1145, 20 Jul 04, SA ^{b7c-4, b6-1} coordinated with SSG ^{b7c-3, b6-3} 391st MP Bn Aid Station, BCCF, AG, for additional treatment records or the x-ray. A detailed search of the files did not reveal either.

BASIS OF INVESTIGATION: The investigation was initiated based upon a Request for Assistance (RFA) for the 78th Military Police Detachment (CID) regarding their case number 0219-04-CID259-80253 concerning allegations of abuse by Detainee [redacted] National Detainee Registration System (NDRS) [redacted] Detainee [redacted] alleged to the International Committee of the Red Cross that he was abused while being detained by US forces at Abu Ghraib prison, Iraq. This RFA answers secondary questions asked by the case agent.

About 1030, 29 Jul 04, SA [redacted] and Interpreter [redacted] Titan Corporation, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq, re-interviewed Detainee [redacted] at the In-Processing facility at the Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (AGI). Detainee [redacted] reiterated his story about how he was restrained in an interrogation room with handcuffs and leg irons and anchored to a bolt in the floor. A soldier was interrogating him when someone either struck or pushed his left shoulder, which pushed him over onto his right side. The impact injured his left wrist. Detainee [redacted] stated that when he struck or pushed no one said anything to him, so he acknowledged that the incident could have been inadvertent; however, someone had been yelling at him shortly before the incident that he could be in Abu Ghraib for 50 or 60 years. He also stated he was blindfolded at the time, so he did not see who touched him or who else might have been in the interrogation room with him.

Detainee [redacted] stated that after the incident he was taken to a medical facility for x-rays. He described the x-ray facility as a large room with white walls. He was placed on a hard table and a camera like device appeared to take pictures of arm from various angles. Detainee [redacted] stated his arm was not placed in a cast, but a splint was placed on it.

Detainee [redacted] stated he could not remember how long he has been in-custody, nor could he remember when the incident occurred. He could estimate how many times he has been interrogated. He also stated that he could not read or write.

About 1800, 29 Jul 04, SA [redacted] interviewed [redacted] Titan Corporation, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq, at the CID office. [redacted] stated she is a category 2 interpreter assigned to the Joint Interrogation and Debriefing Center (JIDC), BCCF, AGI; she has been here since 14 Mar 04.

b7c-3, b6-3 said she remembered assisting in the interrogation of Detainee [redacted] on a number of occasions. She could not remember exactly how many times. [redacted] stated that Detainee [redacted] had been handcuffed, leg ironed, and blindfolded on some occasions when she assisted with his interrogation, and on other occasions he was unrestrained. She stated the decision to restrain or not restrain Detainee [redacted] was made by the interrogator without her in-put. On occasion, while wearing handcuffs and leg irons, Detainee [redacted] was tethered to an I-bolt in the floor of the interrogation room. [redacted] said that SPC [redacted] was Detainee [redacted] senior interrogator. b7c-3, b6-3 b7c-4, b6-4

b7c-3, b6-3 stated she was present when Detainee [redacted] complained about an injury to his wrist. According to [redacted], one of the soldier interrogators was either taking his handcuffs off or putting them on when Detainee [redacted] complained about an injury to wrist. She could not remember if he looked like he was in pain when he was brought into the interrogation room. [redacted] said Detainee [redacted] told two stories as to how his wrist got injured. The first was that someone has pushed him down and the second was that he had fallen on it. She said she did not ask questions to clarify his two stories, but she knew that the injury had not occurred during the interview she was participating in. [redacted] said the interrogator immediately summon SFC [redacted], the PM shift leader, and called a doctor. The doctor had Detainee [redacted] transported to the BCCF hospital for x-rays. The only information she heard after that was that his wrist was not broken. b7c-4, b6-4 b7c-3, b6-3

b7c-3, b6-3 could not remember the date of the interview when the injury was reported. She believed it was sometime in early May 04. She stated the interrogator was "SGT [redacted]" but she could not remember his last name. [redacted] stated she has never seen an interrogator use force on a detainee, and she refused to characterize Detainee [redacted] behavior or attitude toward his interrogators. She said she never holds private conversations with the detainees, so has no personal insight into Detainee [redacted] nor did he never disclose any mistreatment to her. b7c-3, b6-3

b7c-4, b6-4 believes, based upon the information provided by Detainee [redacted] that the incident occurred two or three days before his interrogation by "SGT [redacted]" b7c-4, b6-4 b7c-3, b6-3

b7c-3, b6-3 stated that SPC [redacted] was always very concern when she handcuffed Detainee [redacted] and always asked if the handcuffs were too tight. b7c-4, b6-4

 About 1900, 29 Jul 04, SA [redacted] interviewed SGT [redacted] A Company, 202nd MI Bn, AGI, at the Abu Ghraib CID office. SGT [redacted] stated his first day of work at Abu Ghraib prison was on 10 May 04, and on that day he had sat in on an interrogator of Detainee [redacted] by SGT [redacted]. Prior to starting the interrogation SGT [redacted] said SGT [redacted] provided him with some background on the detainee. One of the issues SGT [redacted] discussed with him was Detainee [redacted] prior allegation of abuse. SGT [redacted] told him Detainee [redacted] had complained that his wrist had been injured with at Abu Ghraib. SGT [redacted] told him Detainee [redacted] wrist had been bandaged at one time, but that it was no longer bandaged. According to SGT [redacted] the injury had occurred three or four days before it was actually report, but SGT [redacted] did not know when the actual injury had occurred.

 SGT [redacted] stated that when he saw Detainee [redacted] he was cooperative and did not complain about any abuse. He was handcuffed in front and did not appear to have been in pain.

 About 1500, 30 Jul 04, SA [redacted] interviewed SGT [redacted] A Co., 202nd MI Bn, BCCF, AGI, at the BCCF CID office. SGT [redacted] stated he knew Detainee [redacted] because he had interrogated him on several times in the past. He said that SPC [redacted] was the primary interrogator assigned to Detainee [redacted]. Between 27 Apr 04 and 2 May 04 he was assigned to interrogate Detainee [redacted] [redacted] was acting as the interpreter. Detainee [redacted] was brought into the interrogation room handcuffed in the front. SGT [redacted] stated he kept Detainee [redacted] handcuffed in front and seated in a chair during the initial portion of the interrogation. About one and half hours into the interrogation, SGT [redacted] said he asked Detainee [redacted] to stand up. SGT [redacted] stated he was pacing back and forth in front of Detainee [redacted] asking him questions. As he was doing this, SGT [redacted] said he noticed a large lump on Detainee [redacted] left wrist. SGT [redacted] said he was startled by his observation and asked Detainee [redacted] what had happened to his wrist. According to SGT [redacted] Detainee [redacted] started to cry and said that he had hurt it three or four days before. SGT [redacted] said he asked Detainee [redacted] how he had injured his wrist and Detainee [redacted] told him he had been left along in the interrogation room while blindfolded, handcuffed, and leg ironed to the floor. There was a pounding on the door and then someone entered abruptly and as he heard foot steps in the interrogation room. Someone leaned over toward him and started to shout into his ear. Detainee [redacted] told SGT [redacted] that the voice sounded like a younger

male. Detainee [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 said he could not understand what was being said to him. After a few seconds, Detainee [redacted] said he felt something hit on the shoulder and push him over. Detainee [redacted] said the blow pushed him over onto his side and he was left on the floor. The individual that was in the room walked out and he righted himself. Detainee [redacted] said the act of pushing him over jerked his left wrist in the handcuffs and injured it. b7c-4, b6-4

SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 stated that immediately after being told by Detainee [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 about his injury. He stopped the interrogation and notified SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4. SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 told SFC [redacted] who put a splint on Detainee [redacted] arm. SFC [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 had Detainee [redacted] transported to the 801st Combat Support Hospital (CSH), BCCF, AGI, for examination. According to SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 the hospital staff x-rayed Detainee [redacted] wrist, but it was not broken; however, the medical personnel who examined him did observe signs of an old, untreated injury. SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 said he completed a report of alleged detainee abuse and turned it in with his interrogation report.

SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 also related he later spoke to SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4. SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 told him that a few days earlier he had been observing SPC [redacted] interrogate Detainee [redacted]. SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 told SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 that he decided to change out SPC [redacted] so he stopped the interrogation and had everyone leave the interrogation room so they could talk. Detainee [redacted] was left in the interrogation room by himself handcuffed and leg ironed to the floor and blindfolded. While they were outside talking, SGT [redacted] said an analyst went into the interrogation room. After a few minutes the analyst left the interrogation room. SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 said he did not know the name of the analyst, but he believed that SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 might be able to identify him.

Agent's Note: The hospital has been unable to locate any record of treating Detainee [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4. No report of abuse from SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 has ever been located. SGT [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 was on leave in the US and not expected to return until mid-August. SFC [redacted] is presently at ANCOC at Fort Huachuca, AZ, and not expected to return until late-August 04.

About 1430, 05 Aug 04, SA [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 interviewed SPC [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4. A Co, 202nd MI BN, BCCF, AGI, at the BCCF CID Office. SPC [redacted] provided a sworn statement in which she stated she had no direct knowledge about how Detainee [redacted]

want to make the following statement under oath: b7c-4, b6-4

I was the principle interrogator assigned to Detainee [REDACTED] from the time he got here in the early part of April 04 until about the end of June 04. During that six-week period, I probably interrogated Detainee [REDACTED] approximately 25 times. There were other interrogators how also interrogated him during that period to time but I was in-charge of interrogation plan. Early in May of 2004, I went to pick Detainee [REDACTED] and I saw that his left wrist was bandaged. I asked him why his wrist was bandaged and all he would say was that he hurt it. Around that same time, I spoke to SGT [REDACTED] and he asked me if I knew who Detainee [REDACTED] injured his wrist. I told him that I had no knowledge of his injured wrist, but that he had complained to me in the past about the leg irons being too tight, so I always loosened them for him. SGT [REDACTED] did not tell me the details of how he injured his wrist and I did not ask. I interrogated Detainee [REDACTED] once or twice after he reported the injury and while he still had the bandage on his wrist. I did not interrogate him again until late June '04. Detainee [REDACTED] never told me how he got hurt. I have no knowledge about how he hurt his wrist or any abuse against him by anyone at Abu Ghraib Prison.

On the date that the detainee complained of pain in his wrist, SGT [REDACTED] entered the JIDC and informed me that the detainee was hurt and that he did not feel like detainee should be interrogated before receiving medical attention. I informed SFC [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 who was the JIDC night shift NCOIC. SFC [REDACTED] and myself went to the booth and looked at detainee's wrist. It did look swollen a little, so we splinted it and then took detainee to the hospital where he received treatment and X-rays. It was later reported, after speaking with detainee again to get the story, that detainee was claiming that interrogators at the JIDC kicked him while he was shackled to the hook on the floor and blindfolded. It is true that on more than one occasion detainee was shackled to the floor and blindfolded while during interrogations by SFC [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4, myself, and others. On one occasion, I was interrogating him and I left the booth for a few minutes as a part of the approach. Detainee was left in the room by himself. The guard outside of the booth was a SPC whose name I do not remember. I went somewhere for a few minutes. I don't remember if I went to the office or latrine or what, but when I returned, the guard was closing the door to the booth. I asked what he was doing and he said that he was just looking in. I walked into the booth and the detainee was laying on the floor. I helped detainee sit up and I asked the guard what happened. The guard said that he did not know, he said that the detainee was sitting up when he looked in [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4

When my interpreter returned a few minutes later, I asked detainees what happened. Detainee stated that he was tired of sitting and tried to lay down. Due to the fact that he was cuffed to the hook, it didn't work out too well. Detainee was not blindfolded at the time, so that was not the incident. I brought it up to SGT [REDACTED] as a joke because we were right in front of the guard and I wanted to mess with him. Quite frankly, I think that the detainee made the incident up to gain sympathy from the interrogator and to deter us from using harsh approaches on him again. That plan didn't work out too well for him.

Basis of Investigation: On 19 Jul 04, this office received an Request for Assistance (RFA) from the 78th Military Police Detachment (CID), Baghdad, IZ, APO AE 09342, concerning an allegation of abuse by Detainee [REDACTED], National Detainee Reporting System (NDRS #) [REDACTED] while he was being detained at the Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Baghdad, IZ.

About 1740, 19 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] b7C-1, b6-1 queried the Biometrics Automated Toolset (BATS) system and verified Detainee [REDACTED] b7C-4, b6-4 identity and confirmed that he was still detained at BCCF.

About 0900, 20 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] b7C-1, b6-4 coordinated with SSG [REDACTED] b7C-3, b6-3 391st MP Bn Aid Station, BCCF, regarding Detainee [REDACTED] medical records. SSG [REDACTED] provided copies of Detainee [REDACTED] medical records detailing his treatment of [REDACTED] when he allegedly passed-out in his cell on 17 May 04. SSG [REDACTED] stated that he specifically remembered the incident since he believed [REDACTED] was faking because when he called his name before entering his cell, he saw [REDACTED] open his eyes briefly. When questioned specifically about the allegation that he was handcuffed and left alone for eight-hours in a detention cell, [REDACTED] stated that he had never made that allegation. He did state he had spoken to a man in civilian clothing, who he believed was in the military, about being interrogated while his hands and feet were restrained by metal handcuffs and anchored to the floor of his interrogation room. During one of those interrogations, which [REDACTED] believed occurred between two and three months ago, one of his Interrogators struck him in the left shoulder. [REDACTED] did not know which interrogator struck him. At the time he was struck, one of his interrogators was asking him about attacks on US and Coalition Forces. The blow was hard enough to knock him over and cause severe pain to his left wrist. [REDACTED] said when he complained to his interrogators about the pain to his wrist they summoned a medical assistance. [REDACTED] stated that the medical personnel took him to a facility, which he believes was on BCCF, and took an x-ray of his wrist. The medical personnel he spoke with after the x-ray was taken told him that the nerves in his wrist were bruised, but that nothing was broken. [REDACTED] stated his wrist has healed and that he has not experienced any long-term complications from the incident.

I was the principle interrogator assigned to Detainee ██████████ from the time he got here in the early part of April 04 until about the end of June 04. During that six-week period, I probably interrogated Detainee ██████████ approximately 25 times. There were other interrogators how also interrogated him during that period to time but I was in-charge of interrogation plan. Early in May of 2004, I went to pick Detainee ██████████ and I saw that his left wrist was bandaged. I asked him why his wrist was bandaged and all he would say was that he hurt it. Around that same time, I spoke to SGT ██████████ and he asked me if I knew who Detainee ██████████ injured his wrist. I told him that I had no knowledge of his injured wrist, but that he had complained to me in the past about the leg irons being too tight, so I always loosened them for him. SGT ██████████ did not tell me the details of how he injured his wrist and I did not ask. I interrogated Detainee ██████████ once or twice after he reported the injury and while he still had the bandage on his wrist. I did not interrogate him again until late June '04. Detainee ██████████ never told me how he got hurt. I have no knowledge about how he hurt his wrist or any abuse against him by anyone at Abu Ghraib Prison.

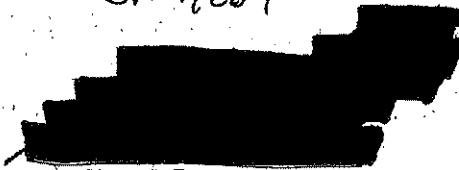

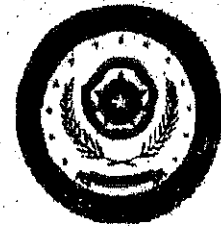
