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

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This investigation was initiated following receipt of information USN, Staff Judge Advocate (SJA), Detainee Operations, First Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF) concerning an allegation that American military members had murdered Kahar Fuzah of K. AWAD, alleged that on/or about 28th through 30th October time frame, American military members (specific service unknown) came to the K. AWAD's farm and killed K. AWAD by cutting his throat. provided command with a photograph purported to be of K. AWAD with no other corroborating photographs (i.e. family photographs to include . The photograph of this deceased male was forwarded to the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (OAFME) to be analyzed to determine the manner and cause of death. MC, USN, Federal Medical Examiner, advised the direction of the wound, type of weapon, and exact injuries to the neck could not be did indicated that the determined from the photograph. wound was most consistent with a cutting of the neck and inconsistent with a gunshot wound, however an autopsy of the victim would have to be performed to make a definitive diagnosis. Numerous efforts to locate and interview and the AWAD family have met with negative results. Efforts to contact them via the cellular telephone number provided command and the attorney that was present when he made the allegation to the command have been unsuccessful. Due to the lack of substantive information to support or refute allegation, this investigation is closed. or his family should be located this However, should investigation will be re-initiated.

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NARRATIVE

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#### SUBJ: I/2MEF/ZAIDON, IZ/POSSIBLE LAW OF WAR VIOLATION IN DEATH OF MA U.S. NAVAL CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIVE SERVICE

- 1. This investigation was conducted regarding possible violation of UCMJ Article 118 (Murder).
- This investigation was initiated following receipt of information concerning an allegation that American military members had murdered K. AWAD. visited the Fallujah Liaison Team (FLT) and reported the incident to command. that an unknown number of American military members arrived in tactical vehicles at K. AWAD's farm at approximately 1700 on or about the 28th through 30th of October, 2005. The military members (NFI), allegedly of K. AWAD, outside in the yard and took K. AWAD inside the home. Screams and praying in Arabic were allegedly heard coming from the home by who remained cuffed outside. After approximately 30 to 60 minutes, the military members exited the home, departed the area. When the entered the home, he found K. AWAD dead on the floor of the family room with his throat cut and an extension cord wrapped around his legs. A photo purported to be K. AWAD was provided to the command. Exhibit (1) pertains. The photoallegedly depicts a deceased male with a large, open wound to his throat area. There is no identifying information in the photograph. Exhibit (2) pertains.
- 3. From Apr06 Jul06, Reporting Agent (RA), with the assistance of an interpreter, attempted on numerous occasions to make contact with via the cellular phone number he provided to the command in an effort to interview him and the AWAD family relative to the allegations. When the interpreter attempted to contact cellular phone, he got a recorded message saying the phone is closed or out of the area. Exhibit (3) pertains.
- On 23MayO6, the photograph of the deceased male was forwarded to the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (OAFME) for review and analysis. On 14Jun06, MC, USN, OAFME, advised the photograph showed a gaping neck wound, which appears to extend from the angle of the right side of the mandible, across the midline of the neck, with the termination point uncertain due to position of the head in the photograph. direction of the wound, type of weapon, and exact injuries to the structures of the neck cannot be determined from the photograph. He did indicate the wound is most consistent with a cutting wound of the neck and is not at all consistent with a quashot wound. noted that with the limited information available and poor quality of the photograph, he could not render a diagnosis to a degree of medical certainty. He indicated an autopsy would be needed to make a definitive diagnosis and even a body in an advanced state of decomposition may yield useful information. Exhibit (4) pertains.
- 5. On 24May06, , USMC, was interviewed by Participant identified as the former Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) for Regimental Combat Team Eight (RCT-8), Camp Fallujah, IZ, reportedly had contact with members of the AWAD family

during Feb06. Telated that on or about 10Feb06, he accompanied NCIS Agents and U.S. Marines to a house in Zaidon, IZ. explained the trip was relative to locating Iraqi civilians who were believed to have been the victims of an alleged assault incident, reportedly committed by Marines from Echo Company, 2dBn, 2dMarRegt. related that while visiting a house in the Zaidon area, one of the Iraqis began telling them about an incident involving coalition forces and led them to a near-by house to show them where the incident occurred. The related he could not recall the specifics of what the Iraqi said, but he remembered that based on the information provided by the Iraqi, to include uniform descriptions, he believed that the coalition unit involved in the incident was likely Army vice Marine Corps. Could not recall if the incident involved a shooting, stabbing or killing but stated that at the time, he was provided with enough information to make him believe that a bad incident had occurred and that coalition forces were involved. The related that based on the information, he provided the family with a claims card to be completed and filed for compensation for any injuries/damages they may have incurred. related that during his time in Iraq, he received many allegations by Iraqi citizens reporting incidents involving coalition forces and that the issuance of a claim card was a normal practice. - when visited the FLT to receive payment for death. 6. On 04Jun06, RA interviewed the Arabic interpreter resent when lawyer, and would attempt to contact him and arrange a meeting. identified the lawyer only by the name of (NFI). provided a sworn statement regarding his interaction with Exhibit (6) pertains.
- 7. Attempts by to contact lawyer, met with negative results. The attempted to reach several times, but was unable to get through because the telephone number given was a cell phone number, and he reached a recording that said the number was not in service. Exhibit (7) pertains.
- Efforts to travel to Zaidon to locate the family is not recommended by command due to the high and volatile insurgent activity in the area. Due to the inability to locate and interview and the AWAD family to obtain information pertaining to the death of K.AWAD, this investigation is closed per NCISHQ concurrence. This investigation will be re-initiated should additional information be developed or the AWAD family comes forth.

RESULTS OF TELEPHONIC INTERVIEW -

- 1. On 24May06, Reporting Agent (RA) received a lead tasking from Special Agent NCIS Detachment, Camp Fallujah, IZ, relative to conducting an interview of USMC. identified as the former Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) for Regimental Combat Team Eight (RCT-8), Camp Fallujah, IZ, reportedly had contact with members of the AWAD family during Feb06. Members of the AWAD family alleged that Kahar Fuzah AWAD was murdered by coalition forces in Oct05.
- 2. Record checks identified is presently assigned as the SJA for Marine Forces Command (MARFORCOM) and located in Norfolk, VA.
- 3. On 24May06, RA contacted by telephone. Confirmed he was assigned as the RCT-8 SJA during Feb06 and recalled meeting with Iraqi civilians at two separate residences in Zaidon, IZ during Feb06.
- 4. Related that on or about 10Feb06, he accompanied NCIS Agents and U.S. Marines to a house in Zaidon, IZ. Rexplained the trip was relative to locating Iraqi civilians who were believed to have been the victims of an alleged assault incident, reportedly committed by Marines from Echo Company, 2dBn. 2dMarRegt (Refer to NCIS CCN Could not recall the specific location of the residence from memory but did recall that he and NCIS agents conducted a "Google Earth" search, which provided them with imagery and location of the residence they were looking for.
- stated upon arriving at residence, they briefly questioned several family members regarding any crimes or incidents they experienced with coalition forces. According to the last all of the Iraqi personnel questioned reported they "knew nothing". The related at the time, he assumed that the investigative team may have identified the wrong house, so they traveled a short distance down the road to a nearby house. The described how to get to the second house from the first house, stating it was approximately 100 meters down the road and to the left. The related the "Google Earth" imagery would identify the proximity of the two houses in relationship to one another.
- at the second house with the birth/delivery of a baby calf. related that while at the second house, one of the Iraqis began telling them about an incident involving coalition forces and led

#### NARRATIVE

- Reference (A) tasked this office with locating and interviewing USMC, Staff Judge Advocate (SJA), Regimental Combat Team Eight (RCT-8), Camp Fallujah, IZ, relative to his contact with the AWAD family members during February 2006. Record checks identified is presently assigned as the Staff Judge Advocate, Marine Forces Command (MARFORCOM), Norfolk, VA.
- On 24May06, was interviewed by telephone and related that on or about 10Feb06, he accompanied NCIS Agents to a farm located in Zaidon, IZ, relative to questioning the residents about an alleged assault committed by USMC personnel, identified within Reference (B). said there was some confusion as to the location of the farm and that they contacted residents of an adjacent farm who provided information about a separate incident involving coalition forces. related he was not sure of what exactly occurred but commented that based on the information gleaned from the family members, it was clear that an incident had occurred and that coalition forces had been involved. #### NARRATIVE

- 1. Ref (a) requested analysis of a photograph of a deceased male be analyzed to provide any details regarding manner of death. A copy of the photograph was provided to , MC, USN, Armed Forces Medical Examiner for review and analysis.
- currently assigned to the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (OAFME), Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, Washington, DC, examined the photograph and provided a Consultation Report on Contributor Material, exhibit (1).
- noted the photograph does show a gaping neck wound, which appears to extend from the angle of the right side of the mandible across the midline of the neck with the termination point uncertain due the position of the head in the picture. He noted the wound is fairly deep, exposing muscle and other soft tissue. wrote the direction of the wound, type of weapon, and exact injuries to the structures of the neck cannot be determined from the photograph. He did indicate the wound is most consistent with a cutting wound of the neck and is not at all consistent with a gunshot and id note that with the limited information wound. i available and poor quality of the photograph, he could not render a diagnosis to a degree of medical certainty. He indicated an autopsy would be needed to make a definitive diagnosis, and even a body in an advanced state of decomposition may yield useful information.
